The World Bank eLibrary offers all formally published works from 1990 for a total of approximately 8,000 works. This includes books, *World Bank Economic Review (WBER)*, *World Bank Research Observer (WBRO journals)*, *Development Outreach* magazine, flagship reports, and Policy Research Working Papers, plus all new publications as they are released. **There are no embargoes on content appearing in eLibrary.**

- Improved citation and reference tools
- Integration of World Bank data, including World Development Indicators
